EASTER HOPE AND HEALING

In some ways, we complete this Easter a *very* long Lent. I don't mean Lent 2021, but Lent 2020, which Covid has made to last right up until now! While we cannot yet declare final victory over Covid, and while further nasty surprises could still be up its sleeve, nevertheless it is right and important to say that light is appearing at the end of the tunnel. Victory over Covid the Coward is dawning!

So, I write to encourage you to let some of that dawn light brighten the eyes of your heart and mind. Let it soothe a little the fears and anxieties of the night and begin to dispel its phantoms and frights. In many ways, this dawn light is like the first light the women saw as they came to the tomb of Jesus in the early morning of Easter day. It doesn't yet say much, but it hints at the glorious light yet to come.

Many have suffered bereavement during this period. In Largs alone, we have had over 20 funerals - very few due to Covid, I hasten to add, but no less painful for all that. Sadly, the restrictions, especially at the beginning, meant that only a minimal kind of prayer service was allowed, not to mention minimal numbers in attendance. And while the Funeral Mass was then gradually allowed, you always felt that the deceased person and their family deserved more as the parish community bade them farewell. So, there are a lot of people who in some real way did not get a chance to grieve properly and with proper support. Your pain is our pain and we want you to know that the prayers and love of parishioners have been with you and your loved ones throughout. Let us hope that the peace of the Easter message will bring you some relief and comfort and, why not, even a budding sense of joy: Christ's risen joy is not just for himself but also for you! Entrust into his arms those you have loved and who have gone. From within those arms, I am very sure they embrace you still.

For other parishioners, the pandemic has brought a variety of problems: a decline in mental health; medical procedures delayed repeatedly; the loss of job and income; a generalised anxiety and fear of the future; a loss of compass; a loss of self-confidence; problems at home; and so many other wee and not so wee difficulties. Many might be reluctant to socialise ever again or beyond a restricted group. Who knows what the return to church will be like once all restrictions are lifted? People will make their own judgments, for good or for ill.

Jesus is well aware of all of these situations and of their details. Yet He holds before us today, not only his Cross, but also his Resurrection. Things can and will be better! There is hope! You can recover that hope! Life still holds much good and much promise for everyone! Hearts can again be uplifted, encouraged and even overjoyed!

There is much healing of hearts, minds and bodies needed as we emerge from the pandemic, and we can all be agents of that healing for one another. I invite you to ask the Risen Jesus very simply to heal whatever brokenness you are experiencing and to lift the weight that may lie on your heart. Be creative in the power of his resurrection in finding ways to become agents of healing to others in the parish and in the town. This year, more than many others, we must draw on our faith and trust in Christ that Easter is the dynamo of all our hope and healing. Alleluia!
